GREENERAGE CONSORTIUM MET IN FRANKFURT, GERMANY!



The GreenerAge consortium recently had their 4th hybrid Transnational Project Meeting, where they talked about their project. The meeting took place on June 13th and 14th in Frankfurt, Germany. They discussed the work they have done so far and what they will do next.

We have successfully tested the **GreenerAge platform**, which means people will soon be able to explore different topics about sustainability in an interesting and interactive way. We are preparing a gamified experience with quizzes, videos, suggestions for further reading, and tools that you can use on your phone or computer.

Right now, we are reviewing a **manual for trainers**. If you are a trainer, you will find practical tips on how to talk about environmental and climate change issues. They will also show you how to use the online platform easily.

We are also working on a report that will have examples of good practices in sustainability from cities, countries or Europe, for example. The aim is to create **policy recommendations** and we will also make a booklet that summarizes this information for policymakers.

The **compendium**, which gives a quick overview of important topics like sustainable food, climate literacy, transport, and sustainable mobility, is almost finished. You will find tips that you can use in your everyday life at home or with your community.
